<p>City of Fort Worth Community Action Partners program</p>	<p>The City of Fort Worth Community Action Partners program is accepting mail-in PDF applications or online applications for electric, gas or propane utility bill assistance or rental assistance.</p> <p>"Some facts about the rental assistance program: landlords must register with the city as a vendor. Payments are made directly to the landlord or property management company. Funding is limited and based on income eligibility. Applicants are encouraged to pay as much as they can on their rent or mortgage. Due to the high volume of applications, expect delayed processing times. Applicants must provide these documents: Proof of citizenship or legal status in the United States, such as a passport, birth certificate or resident alien card. Proof of income for the past 30 days for everyone over the age of 18 in the household. Photo identification. Social Security numbers for everyone in the household. Copy of the utility bill (gas, electric or propane). Signed SAVE (Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements) documents for everyone in the household. Signed Declaration of Income form (to be used if the applicant has no income). For rental assistance, present a signed, current lease document."</p>	<p>4200 S. [FWHS TAKES MEASURES TO PROTECT HEALTH AND SAFETY DUE TO COVID-19](#)

At Fort Worth Housing Solutions, your health and safety are our top priorities. As the outbreak of COVID-19 continues to impact our area, we are taking precautions to limit in-person interactions as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

There will be no evictions for non-payment of rent for Housing Choice Voucher holders, public housing residents and tenants who live in Low-Income Housing Tax Credit properties through July 25, 2020. This temporary moratorium on evictions is part of the relief bill that Congress passed and the president signed into law. No late fees or penalties will be charged during this time period.

The moratorium only applies to evictions for non-payment of rent. It does not prevent any other type of eviction, such as if the tenant poses an imminent threat of physical harm to the landlord, their employees or other tenants, or if a tenant is engaged in criminal activity.
